

EXPLANATORY NOTE ON HEALTH SECTOR.

Health is an important social sector. Its facilities are essential not only to provide clean and diseases free atmosphere to live but also to enhance the efficiency and productivity of population.

The institutions like Hospitals, Dispensaries, Rural Health Centers (RHC), Basic Health Units (BHU) and their staff with sufficient number of Medical and Para Medical Staff is necessary for treatment and other useful guidance to protect the peoples from various kinds of diseases and to become healthy.

This sector contains various kinds of data:-

- i) Number of Hospitals, Dispensaries, Rural Health Centers (RHC), Basic Health Units (BHU) MCH and T.B Clinics with their beds by district 2014-15 to 2017-18.
- ii) Number of Doctors, Nurses, LHV's/Dais/Midwives by sex and by district, 2014-15 to 2017-18.
- iii) Number of indoor and out-door patients treated in Hospitals, Dispensaries, Rural Health Centers etc. by sex and by district up to 2017-18.
- iv) District-wise Malaria control activities 2017-18 is also included in this sector.

Some very important and simple formulas, which are often used in Health Sector, are indicated below:-

$$i) \quad \text{Population per Hospital} = \frac{\text{Total population of the unit}}{\text{No. of Hospitals}}$$

$$ii) \quad \text{Population per Doctor} = \frac{\text{Total population of the unit}}{\text{No. of Doctors}}$$
